¿What is **DIGIBUILD**?

DIGIBUILD is a project of the Erasmus+ Program of the European Union. It aims to promote comprehensive training in digital skills in agriculture, mainly for professionals in the green sector in Costa Rica and Honduras. This will allow them to leverage technology to improve access to services, information, and market opportunities.

The project is being implemented by a consortium composed of seven organizations:



The DIGIBUILD team held its first in-person work meeting in April in Madrid, Spain.



This activity allowed the project partners to get to know each other and establish the working basis for implementing the project. This in-person meeting has been complemented by monthly virtual meetings, which contribute to the coordination and monitoring of the actions programmed within the project framework.

One of the project's initial activities was holding workshops with experts from the green sector in Costa Rica and Honduras. The goal was to conduct a thorough assessment, establish partnerships with strategic allies, and understand the beneficiaries needs to develop tools that address these needs through digitalization.



These workshops involved over 30 participants from the green sector in both countries, including producers, trainers, technicians, and representatives from government entities, among others.
